

Pennsylvania Legislature.

[CLOSE OF YESTERDAY'S PROCEEDINGS.]

SENATE.—The following bills were passed today: Providing for introducing a sufficient supply of fresh and pure water into Philadelphia.

For the protection of farmers against the ravages of wild cats in Dauphin and other counties.

A supplement to an act incorporating the Susquehanna and Delaware Railroad Company.

The bill equalizing the territories and tax-districts of the Twentieth and Twenty-first Wards was objected to.
