TORNADO IN CAMBRIA.—A frightfully se-vere tornado swept over part of Cambria county, Pa., on Thursday, doing a vast amount of damage. Twenty acres of trees, on the farm of John Miller, Jr., in Yoder township, and over ten acres on the farm of Joseph Strayer were torn up by the scatter Joseph Strayer, were ton up by the roots. Strayer's fences were blown like feathers over his fields. His barn was moved from its foundation. On the farm of Fronheiser & Kurtz the large orchard was almost wholly destroyed, and the house, barn and spring house were unroofed. On the farm spring nouse were unrouted. On the farm of the Cambria Iron Company much damage was done to the fences. When the hurri-cane reached the southern boundary of Johnstown, it struck the side of the hill and prostrated thirty or forty acres of heavy timber, twisting into splinters those trees which refused to come up by the roots. The barn on Dibert's estate was unroofed. The barn on Dicert's estate was unrooted, and the whole building was moved about three feet. From here the hurricane passed into Richland township, where it almost de-stroyed Mr. Abraham Goughnour's large sugar camp, and threw down hundreds of fine trees on his farm. 


