From Washington. WASHINGTON, April 10.—The House Judiciary Committee to-day took up the resolution referred to yesterday, in regard to the trial of President Davis. They appointed a sub-committee of three to examine all the evidence in possession of the Government, connecting Davis with the assassination of President Lincoln.

The bill to pay Pennsylvania seven hundred thousand dollars for war expenses has just passed the Senate. Rumors are again rife of trouble in the Cabinet. They were called together this morning at an early hour.

XXXIXTH CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION.

SENATE.—Mr. Saulsbury (Del.) presented a resolution reaffirming the resolution adopted by the Senate in July, 1861, that the President should be impeached in the event of his removal from office, and endorsing President Johnson for his efforts to restore peace and harmony on that basis.

Mr. Sumner (Mass.) objected to the present consideration of the above and it went over. Mr. Saulsbury gave notice that he would call it up on Friday next.

A bill to reimburse the State of Pennsylvania for her war expenses was passed. A bill to grant a 100,000 acres of public land to aid in constructing a ship canal from Lake Superior to Lac La Poudre, in the State of Michigan, was passed.

Two thousand extra copies of the Coast Survey report were ordered to be printed. House.—Mr. Chandler (N. Y.) stated that if he had been present yesterday when the vote was taken on the Civil Rights bill he would have voted in the negative.

Mr. Driggs (Mich.) stated that he had been called out by unavoidable business yesterday, and was absent but twenty-seven minutes. When he came back he would have voted in the affirmative. Mr. Davies (Mass.) offered a resolution; which was adopted, directing the Secretary of War to furnish the House with the findings of the commission in the case of the awards for the captors of Booth and Harold.

Mr. Cullom (Ill.), from the Committee on Foreign Affairs, reported back two joint resolutions of the Senate, authorizing Admiral Paulding and Commodore William Radford to accept decorations from the King of Italy in recognition of their services rendered in the case of the D'Almeida, which were considered and passed.

Mr. Raymond (N. Y.), from the Committee on Foreign Affairs, reported a resolution requesting the President to inform the Senate when the case of the bill to protect the rights and interests of American citizens in the fishing grounds adjacent to the British provinces, and whether any legislation or other action on the part of Congress is in his judgment necessary to secure those rights and interests, in consequence of the abrogation of the Reciprocity treaty of 1854.

Mr. Raymond explained the condition of the question in regard to the fisheries; and the resolution was adopted.
