

XXXIXTH CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION. [CLOSE OF YESTERDAY'S PROCEEDINGS.]

SENATE.—The reconstruction-resolution was taken up. The question was upon Mr. Johnson's amendment to strike out the third section, which disfranchises the late rebels until 1870.

Mr. Johnson demanded the yeas and nays, and the third section was struck out by a unanimous vote—yeas, 43; nays, none; absent, 6.

Mr. Howard rose to offer several amendments to the pending Reconstruction resolution. They are as follows:

Section 1. All persons born in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside.

Section 2. Repetition of the bill shall be appointed among the several States which may be included within this Union according to their respective numbers, counting the whole number of persons in each State and counting Indians not taxed.

Section 3. The bill shall be amended in the following manner: That any railroad company for transportation or fares without compensation, nor impair or change the conditions imposed by any act of Congress.

Section 4. All obligations of the United States incurred in suppressing insurrection, or in defence of the Union, or for payment of bounties in connection with insurrection, shall remain inviolate.
