OPIUM .--- It has been discovered that the poppy is indigenous to a large part of Ari-zona. According to the report of Major Duffield, United States Marshal in Arizona, this plant is also found growing in its natural wild state in the valley of the Santa Cruz river. The production of opium opens up a valuable source of wealth. Mr. Emanuel Weiss, of Pennsylvania, who has paid much attention to the matter, says: "Two families, with but two able field hands, can put ten acres of land under cul-tivation, which will yield about 1,300 pounds of merchantable opium, containing nearly ten per cent. of morphine."
