

Later from Mexico. New Orleans, Oct. 24.—Brownsville advices of October 10th, which were reviewed in the Bulletin, not yet having gone to Monterey.

There is no truth in the report that Mejia had attacked Monterey. All was quiet in this respect. He remains there. Trevino has gone towards San Louis Potosi, with two thousand men, to look after Mejia, who is reported at Matamoros. The latter is on his way to Matamoros with one thousand men. A private letter, received in Brownsville, announces a severe battle near Matamoros, in which the Liberals under Naranjo and Martinez defeated the Imperialists, who were led by the late General Mejia.

This victory literally placed Saltillo in the hands of the Imperialists, who were daily expected to advance. A long despatch is said to have been recently received from Napoleon, which had the effect of halting some French troops about Matamoros. It is supposed to be prepared for active service. Confidence in Canales' ability to hold Matamoros is increasing. His force is said to be fifteen hundred strong, of whom were boys. It is reported that good authority that Juarez had directed the arrest of Canales and Hinojosa, and their trial by court-martial.
