BALTIMORE, Nov. 1.—Great excitement prevails here in consequence of the Governor's decision.

BALTIMORE, Md., Nov. 1.—It is not yet ascertained who are the new Commissioners.

It is rumored that the new force have already organized, and will make their appearance in the course of the day.

The old Commissioners have their full force out, and will resist the demand of the new force for the surrender of the stations, the marsh's office, &c.

It is reported that John F. Ford, of Ford's Theatre notoriety, and Captain Horn, of the Third Ward (one of Governor Swann's Registers), have been selected for Police Commissioners, and ex-Marshal Van Nostrand, one of the witnesses for the prosecution, is the new Marshal.

A body of 400 dismounted cavalry, who arrived here yesterday to embark for Texas, are now at Fort McHenry, and rumor says they will be retained here to act in case of an emergency.

There is considerable feeling manifested, some approving and others bitterly denouncing the action of the Governor.

Knots of people are gathering at the corners of the streets and near the newspaper offices discussing affairs, but otherwise all is quiet.

The new force have not as yet made their appearance, but it is supposed they will do so in the course of the day.

The names above given as the new Commissioners and Marshal are given in rumor, but are probably correct.

From Havana.

NEW YORK, November 1st.—The steamer Eagle brings Havana dates of October 27th.

Rumors were current the past week, which were pretty well authenticated, of the landing of a cargo of negroes near Juca and Cardenas. The Governor General sent officers to investigate the matter.

The Governor General met with enthusiastic receptions at various places visited by him.

The United States steamer Rhode Island, with Admiral Falmer on board, was at Havana on the 25th.

The Government agent commissioned to buy two Monitors of the United States government is a passenger by the Eagle.

Death of Senator Wright.

NEWARK, Nov. 1.—The Hon. Wm. Wright, United States Senator, died this morning at 3 o'clock, aged 75 years.

He was one of the earliest and most enterprising manufacturers of this city, to whom much of its remarkable prosperity is due.

He has held many public positions of honor and trust, and was twice elected United States Senator. His death is deeply deplored by the entire community. His present term expires in 1869. The funeral will take place on Saturday next.

Fire in Massachusetts.

BOSTON, Nov. 1.—C. & J. R. Pierce's nail and heel plate factory, at Milford, was wholly consumed by fire to-day.

A part of the building was occupied by Lilley & Co.'s needle works. The fire soon communicated to the Boston and Worcester railroad freight house, which was destroyed, with all the contents. The fire is supposed to have been the work of an incendiary. Pierce's loss is \$40,000 with an insurance of \$15,000. Lilley & Co.'s loss is not known. The Boston and Worcester Railroad Company lose \$9,000.
