OTTAWA, November 21.-Deer in large numbers are being killed back in the forest by American hunters, and sent to the New York market. The papers are urging that means be adopted to stop such work.

It is reported that a difficulty has arisen in regard to the Hon. D'Arcy McGee's going officially to England and France, in consesuence of some indiscreet utterances lately made by him.

TORONTO, C. W., NOV. 21.-A special commission, under which the remaining Fenian prisoners are to be tried, has been received by the authorities here, and it is expected that the sheriff will forthwith receive a precept to summon the necessary jury. There are 39 Fenians altogether remaining in jail, 7 of whom have been sentenced, leaving 32 yet awaiting trial, which will take place immediately, commencing probably on the 3d proximo.

Arrival of the Africa.

HALIFAR, Nov. 21.-The steamship Africa -from Liverpool, Nov. 10th, via Queenstown, Nov. 11th-has arrived here.

The usual banquet was given by the new Lord Mayor of London, on the 9th inst. All the Cabinet Ministers were present. The Earl of Derby in his speech said the Ministry desired to earn the good will of the people by their acts, but he thought it would not be well at present to state how they proposed to carry their desire into effect. The firm has suddenly subsided, and the creditors are in pursuit. The losses are estimated at \$100,000 to \$150,000. 
