New Orleans, Nov. 28.—The steamer Alliance, from Vera Cruz, brings Mexican dates to the 23d inst. Maxilian's baggage had arrived at Vera Cruz, but he was still at Orizaba, where he has been residing for the last three weeks as a private gentleman, not exercising any of the functions of office.

In the port of Vera Cruz were two French and Austrian frigates; also a frigate at Tampico. Maxilian was at the City of Mexico, the French now hold that place, Puebla, Orizaba and Vera Cruz, using Cordova as an impregnable stronghold, and the capture of the Pas del Morelio as an outpost for Vera Cruz.

They hold no other possessions in Mexico. It is rumored that the Church party have offered to raise \$500,000 for the support of the Emperor. An American protestant is regarded by the people as the only savior of the present difficulties. On Tuesday, November 27, the French and Austrian moved in overwhelming force on Jalapa, which was strongly fortified and garrisoned by the Mexican and Austrian troops.

The Mexicans for several days at intervals. The Mexican troops deserted to the Liberal party, and the Imperial troops were driven to the mountains, where they were cut off from supplies of food and water. The commanding was distinctly heard over fifty miles.

The final attack was made on the city on the 11th inst, when the Imperialists surrendered as prisoners of war, and were respected. On the 11th Colonel Dapau, with 1,000 men, arrived at San Bartolome on the way to Jalapa, but being of the surrender, returned to Orizaba.

The Alliance brought despatches for the American and British consuls at this port, the purport of which is as follows:—

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29.—Although no formal official communication has been made to this Government, there is no doubt that the information has been received by the French from Mexico at the earliest practicable time, the arrangements for that purpose now being in progress. The Imperial army, the first detachment, or one-third of the troops, were not embarked in November, according to the Emperor's programme, but that the other two-thirds have been seriously damaged by the Liberals, who were persistently pressing them.

To obviate such a result, it was deemed most prudent to order the Imperial army to move them all at once, and there is no doubt that this will be done. Such speculation has been indulged in as to the actual progress of the Imperial army, and the accompanying Minister General bell to Mexico. The truth, however, is that the Imperial army is still in Mexico, and military movements on the frontier, should an emergency arise to require a new disposition of our troops; but in respect to the Emperor's intention, it is not supposed that such a necessity will occur.

The late news received by the Government respecting Maxilian, is that he was at Orizaba, the French officials refusing to permit him to leave Mexico unless he formally resigns his crown.

THE LATE CAVE JOHNSON.—Cave Johnson died at the age of nearly 74 years, at his residence in Chestnut street, on Friday, the 23d inst. He had long been feeble, and his death was not unexpected. He was born in Robertson county, Va., in 1793, was a lawyer by profession, earning a fair competence at the bar, and for several years held the office of Circuit Judge. In 1827, he was nominated on the Republican ticket, and elected to Congress. He represented his district during the entire term of the Presidency of John Tyler, and by subsequent re-elections remained in Congress until 1846, when he was appointed Postmaster General under President Polk's Administration. Mr. Johnson was a member of the Senate of the United States, and was elected to the office of Governor of the State of Tennessee in 1858. He was a man of industrious habits, of fair talents, and possessed considerable ability as a statesman.
