From Missouri-Proclamation from the Governor. [By the United States Associated Press.]

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 11.-Governor Fletcher has issued a proclamation, stating that a portion of the State of Missouri is infested with murderers, who defy the civil authority, and have the sympathy and aid of such a number of the people of the counties where they have their haunts; and they have so intimidated, or obtained the sympathy of the local authorities, that peaceable citizens are not secure in the possession of their property. He, therefore, calls for twenty-four companies of cavalry and ten companies of infantry, to be organized in the regular way, to preserve the peace and protect the citizens, and bring them to trial. Adjutant General Simpson has issued

general orders for the organization and proper equipment of this force.
