

CITY BULLETIN.

PHILADELPHIA CATTLE MARKET, Aug. 26th.—Beef cattle were in fair demand this week, but prices were without material change. About 2,500 head arrived and sold at 16 1/2 to 17 1/2 cents for extra Penna. and Western steers; 13 1/2 to 14 1/2 for good, and 10 1/2 to 11 1/2 for common, as to quality.

Sheep were dull and rather lower; 12,000 head arrived and partly sold at the Avenue Drove Yard at from 4 1/2 to 5 1/2 c. per lb., gross, as to condition.

Cows were in fair demand; 250 head sold at \$60 to \$70 for Springers, and \$60 to \$80 for head for cow and calf.
