Sabbath, August 25th.—Crowds along the street. Numbers drunk, stretched on the pavement. Whiskey abandoned. Sunday law inoperative. Back doors kept open. Here two men fighting, and a woman in the middle trying to part them.

Sabbath-school in the afternoon. Preaching at night. A man in the church approached me and said: "Mr. Long, I am hungry, give me five cents to get a loaf of bread."

B. Tullidge, late of the Board of Registration, of this (Yalobusha) county.

Musters, of New York, I have pleasure in certifying that the registration for this (Yalobusha) county was properly performed by them, and in compliance with the law and instructions, and my inspection has failed to detect any errors, and that I have investigated Mr. Tullidge's charges against these gentlemen, and find them false and without foundation.

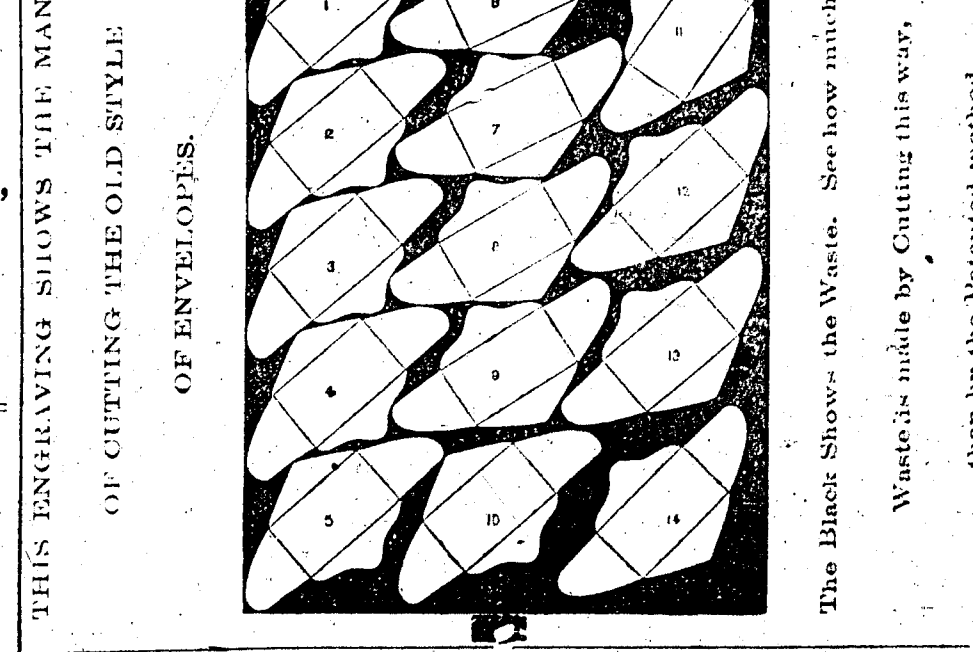

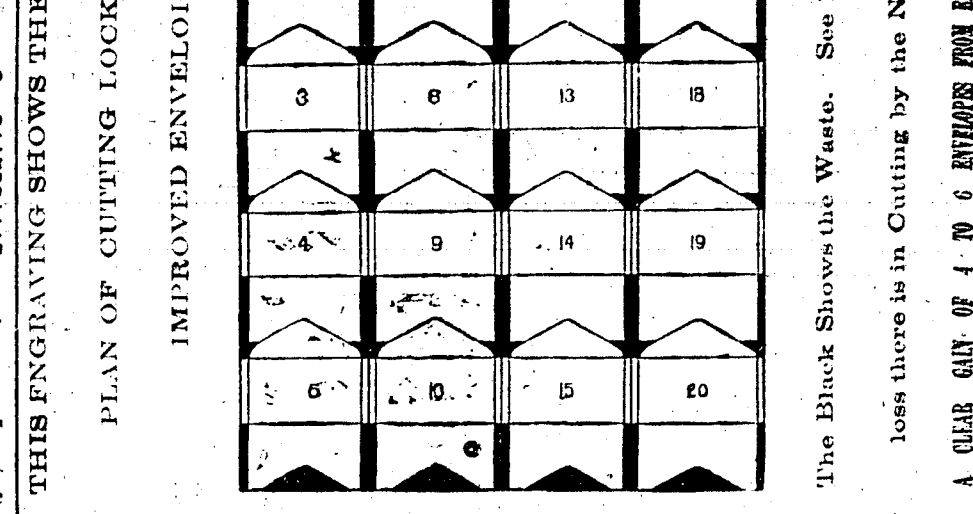
