A BRIDGE BETWEEN PHILADERPHIA AND CAMDEN. -Last evening a large meeting of citizens of Camden. N. J., was held at the new Court House in that city to N. J., was held at the new Court House in that city to take measures regarding the speedy construction of a bridge to span the Delaware River between Camden and Philadelphia. Early in the evening a brass band paraded through the streets of the city, followed by a large crowd, who subsequently proceeded to the Court House to take part in the meeting. The hall was filled to its utmost capacity, and considerable enthusiasm was manifested. The meeting was called to order by the selection of Mayor Charles Cox as Chairman. The first business in order was the appointment of a committee to draft a series of resolutions. This committee consisted of the following named gentlemen: P. C.
