SEO. 2. And be it further enacted. That all of said territory, with its ports, harbors, bays, rivers and waters, shall constitute customs collection district, to be called the District of Alaska, for which said district a port of entry shall be established at some convenient point, to be designated by the President, at or near the town of Sitka or New Archargel, and a collector of customs shall be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, who shall reside at the port of entry, and who shall receive an annual salary of \$2,500, in addition to the usual legal fees and emoluments of the office, but his compensation shall not exceed \$4,000 per annum, or a proportionate sum for a less period of time.

SEC. 4. That the Secretary of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized to make and prescribe such regulations us he may deem expedient for the nationalization of all vessle owned by actual residents of the said ceded territory on and since the 20th day of June, 1807, and which shall continue to have been so owned up to the date of such nationalization.
