

Harriet Prescott Spofford.

A French writter by the name of Tenot has written a history of the coup d'état, compiled from authentic documents, which gives many new and startling details of the outrages committed by the troops under the authority of Napoleon. Among other horrible incidents he tells the following story:

"When a column of troops ordered to put down the insurgents in the Var reached Salernes, there were eighty prisoners chained in the rear. At Salernes the officer in command resolved to execute a prisoner, a weaver, named Giraud, and also another man from Vernon, called Antoine N————, who seems to have been selected for no better reason than that he was accidentally coupled with Giraud. The column marched on towards Lorgues, leaving these two prisoners behind at the mayoralty. TO CONTRACTORS.
