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THE CONTROL OF THE PRILADADERIA STREAM STR A writer in the London Daily News, who made a trip through the sewers of London last month, thus describes what he "Through the kindness of Mr. Haywood, the engineer to the city, we had been handed over to an experienced and practical guide, who, with a staff of workmen, proceeded to introduce us to the sewers of London. Before visiting these places you must dress for the part. Long thick woolen stockings the part. and slimy, and your footing is often soft and slippery—that is all. Our chief guide has a strong faith in the wholesomeness of sewers.
