THE PHILADELPHIA LIBRARY.—The Phila-delphia Library Company has purchased a site for a new building, in accordance with the purpose which has long been entertained of removing the Library to a more western of remov location.

of removing the Library to a more wostern location. The lot purchased is on the northwest corner of Locust and Juniper streets, opposite to the Episcopal Academy, measuring 110 feet on the Locust street front, with a depth of 240 feet on Juniper street, including the properties of the Rutherford and Livezey estates. There is a ten-foot alley on the west of the property, thus giving three fronts to the new building. The location is a most desirable one, central and yet quiet, and the property is abundantly large for the crection of such a building as this valuable Library requires. It has been purchased for the sum of \$75,000, and with the full approbation of the executor of the Rush bequest. The building of the new Library on Locust street has, of course, no bearing upon the question of the Library Com-pany to crect the new building immediately. The Building Fund does not yet warrant the company has some immediate prospect of solling its old property. The purchase has been made to secure a desirable property, and as a judicious investment of the Building Fund.
