Voorhees, a prominent builder, ex-member of the Board of Supervisors, and a candidate for the Mayoralty, had been brutally murdered in asaloon, at the corner of Columbus and Carroll streets. It seems that Voorhees, who was not a drinking man, visited the saloon upon some business matter, whon an indi-vidual fwith whom he was not ac-quainted, named Chambers, entered the place, and after taking a drink of whisky, drew a pistol, and without the slightest pro-vocation, shot Voorhees through the head. The builist entered the left eye, penetrated to the brain, and lodged there. This morning Mr. Voorhees is reported to be in a dying condition. Chambers has been arrested. He says he was intoxicated, and does not recol-lect anything of the aftair. lect anything of the affair. Died from his Injuries.

# Mr. Voorhees, who was shot by Chambers here last night, lingered in great agony until 1 o'clock this morning, when he expired. The affair causes a great deal of excitement, espe-
