Whipping-Post and the Scenes of

Last Naturday. [Deportorial Correspondence.] NEW CASTLE, Delaware, Saturday, May 14. -If any inland town in an old Slave State is tenced in and finished, it is this anathetic andsompolent county-town of the State erst carried in the breeche's-pockets of Saulsbury and Bayard. In the way of big aches during the rebellion, this little toe-corn especially distinguished itself. Its party leaders clung to slavery with a bull-dog tenacity and grit that matched the corresponding stubbornness of Toombs and Letcher. In the interior these demagogues still lead the people by the mose. Their bold will remain upon them until the autumnal election.

The people around New Castle look upon the coming change with a degree of sullenness not allogether unprovocative of mirth to un-sympathizing strangers who come among them. Of all the malcontents the sorestbeaded subjects here are people who not only never enjoyed the proprietorship of a "nig-ger," but hadn't sufficient energy to own a The politicians are working wisely. The politicians are working wisely. To-day being a part of court-week; a meeting was called in the town square to form a white man's party. Speakers were announced and some endeavors made to drum tog. e la crowd. There was no crowd. The party ex-prected to come from Wilmington didn't come. In the train were Mr. Wright, Secretary of the State of Delaware, and ex-State Attorney Col. Chas. B. Lore. Neither alighted from the car. With a -honglation of which one-fifth car. With a population of which one fifth-are "niggers," they very sensibly see the band-writing upon the Democratic wall in the Diaword State. What the leaders are now doing is trying to propitiate the colored vote-tryis training to prophrate the colored vote-try-ing to throw feathers, against a gale of wind. The only people who did alight were Rev. Mr. Latimer, the pastor of Calvary P.E. Church, at Wilmington; a imember of the Peace Society who don't fwant his identity, disclosed, and the writer of this latter. The chloset of their will runs also the letter. The object of their visit was also the object of ours—to witness the quadrennial ad-ministration of vinductive justice, in the shape of the public pillory and public lash. It is to be hoped that this exhibition will be the last ever to take place upon American coil. The merciless whacks of the BULLETIN in this direction have shamed the best people of the vicinity. They have so humiliated Sheriff Pichardson that he invariably sinks his title and identity whenever he goes out of the

State. In order to get, rid of this distasteful task. this morning with as little publicity as possible? the gentleman plied his lash and got up an appetite for breakfast at 7 o'clock in the morning. This was done to head off such outsiders as Rev. Mr. Latimer, the Peace Society gen-tleman above referred to; and ourselves. The culprits numbered seven. Six of them were negroes. The scarifying endorsement of the catoo ine tails was written upout their flesh to the number of 20 lashes each. The other, whose name is James E. Sudler, got a double dose. The larceny was this man's third of-fence. Mr. J. M. Wise, the Warden of the prison, who stands among the upper-crust Methodists of the place, informs us that the circumstance is the only one ever occurring in the county. More than this, he states that he never previously knew the same man ever to he a second time scourged. This was done to head off such outsiders second time scourged.

The instrument of torture is capable of cut-ting deeply into the fiesh. The force of the blows is optional with the Sheriff. While we didn't witness the infliction of the push-ment, we did see the backs of these who received it. Candor compels us to say that in no case was blood drawn. The man who received the forty lashes was again at work when the train arrived. When we asked if the punish-ment hurt him, he uttered that short chuckle promilar to his race, and said: "Well, marser, it's jest dis yer way: My ole marser down in Sussex had a Yankee overseer. I guess, marser, I'se had fifty lickins a good deal worse dan dis yer one. Tell yer, boss (looking up from his rag-picking), dat obersee didn't often drop de whip till the blood was clar ober de whole on't." he forty lashes was again at work when the scratch, but was terribly frightened. Anothe The white man was an object of commiserabruised—at least not more than skin-deep, but the leather had entered into his soul. He was bonored with the first introduction to the cat. As the entire job was done inside of twenty ininutes, the strokes of the falling leather must have been rather rapid. The seven men were ranged in line just inside the inner jail yard eate, with backs bared to receive the infliceate, with backs bared to receive the inflo-tion. The Warden called their names. Each man stepped in turn up to the post. An iron contrivance secured their hands, and as rap-idly as the Sheriff could ply his lash the tale "div as the sheriff could ply his lash the tale of blows was given and received. In the Warden's office, as we passed out, we saw a well-dressed, good-looking young man, receiving some money. We supposed him to be a business visitor. At the early age of nineteen, after a two years' incarceration for a burglary in the adjoining town of Cen-traville he was going forth again into the vorld. The money he received was his earnings from overwork in trade of carpet-weaving. He had received sixty lashes as part of his sentence, and upon his back the telltale scourge had left its unobliterable imreinale scourge had left its unoblication im-press. Could he remove them, he told us, he would willingly undergo another two years' incarceration as the price of the damned spot. He had earned bandsome apparel, and had \$28 in his pocket. He went down the steps of the prison portico, with no smile upon his face-down into the busy world-down, where, in the struggle of life, the discharged and lashscarred convict is the mark of obloquy and scorn-down; who cares where? THE LATEST BAILWAY SLAUGHTER.

Frightful Collision on the Pacific Ball-riad-Mineteen Persons Killed and Aniry Wounded. (From the St. Louis Democrat, May 13.) Perhaps not since the Gasconde disaster has such awful intelligence startled St. Louis as that which smote the ears and hearts of our people yesterday, that a fearful collision and loss of life had occurred on the Missouri Pacific Railroad, near Eureka, some thirty miles distant. Scene of the Disaster.

The accident occurred about a mile and a half east of Eureka, near a point of rocks at a

half east of Eureka, near a point of rocks at a stone-house. Around this point of rocks the road makes a sharp cuive and runs on an imbankment about twenty feet high for a distance of half a mile. At this point the road curves very much, and it is impossible for a train to be seen more than a hundred yards aliead. On each side of the embankment were fragments of cars, and bolts and bales of merchandise. Laborers were at work collect-ing the goods, and women and children were standing in groups gazing upon the scene of the wreck. The theyes were notidle. One man took a velvet vest from a box of clothing, and. took a velvet vest from a box of clothing, and, secreting it under his vest, carried it away. Another man rifled the pockets of a dead man.

Another man rifled the pockets of a dead man. On the freight train were a good many barrels of coal-oll, which were rolled down the em-bankment, some of them falling to pieces and strewing their contents over the dead and wounded. Fortunately there was no fire on either train, and no lamps burning. The acci-dent occurred at 5:20 o'clock. Two of the sleeping-cars were pretty well filled with sleepers, and as neither of these cars was thrown from the track, the accident was not so had as it would have been it it had occurred.

so had as it would have been it it had occurred later in the day, A conductor informed us that the collision occurred between train No. 35-an extra freight train going west-and No. 4, a passen-ger train going east; that the conductor of the freight train, William Odor, was ordered to run thirty minutes on the time of, the pas-senger train; that he left the city at 3 o'clock, and that he should have arrived at Eureka, sixty miles distant, at 5.10; that being behind his time, he should have stopped at St. Paul, six miles this side of Eureka; that the con-ductor of No. 4, George J. Dubois, having got behind time at Otterville, should have stopped at Eureka. We do not pretend to s up that this theory is the correct one, or upon whom the blame should rest.
