WASHINGTON, May 16.—The Committee on Ways and Means to-day report the Tax bill, having finished its consideration at meeting held this morning.

The tax on sales and gross receipts is abolished, with the exception of theatres and other places of amusement.

The bill also proposes to relieve the railroad companies from the tax upon their gross receipts, and making in lieu of an amount not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars free from tax.
