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But with all this whirl of preparation, with all this formidable appearance of armament and fortifications, with all the devastation of the city, and with all the anxiety and uneasiness which these things may be questioned whether Paris can or will sustain the attack of the Prussian army with success.

It is supposed, however, to number about 60,000 men, and that the original army of the Crown Prince a part of the troops which were engaged about Metz, and reserves which have been brought up into the rear of the city.

It is very certain that unless some unforeseen combination of circumstances shall intervene to raise the siege of Paris, the Prussians will succeed in their enterprise.

It is reported that the Prussians have accepted their position in the city, and that they are able to defend themselves as well as to attack.

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
