Perpetual Weather Table.

It is quite possible that the study of the following weather table may be of much benefit to farmers and others, if they only follow the admonitions. was constructed by the celebrated Dr. Hershell, upon a philosophic considera-tion of the attraction of the sun and moon. It is confirmed by the experience of many years' observation, and will suggest to the observer what kind of weather will probably follow the moon's en-trance into any of her quarters. As a general rule it will be found wonderfully

If the moon changes at 12 o'clock, noon the weather immediately afterward will be very rainy, if in summer, and there will be snow or rain, if in winter.

If between 3 and 4 o'clock,p. m.,change-

able in summer—fair and mild in winter. Between 4 and 5 o'clock, fair, both in winter and summer.

Between 9 and 10 o'clock, p. m., in summer, fair, if the wind is northwest; rainy, if south or southwest. In winter, fair and frosty, if the wind is from the south or southwest.

Between 10 and 12 o'clock, p. m. rainy in summer and fair and frosty in

Between 10 at night and 2 o'clock, a m., fair in summer and frosty in winterunless the wind is from the south or southeast.

Between 2 and 4 o'clock, a. m., cold and very showery in summer, and snow and storm in winter. Between 4 and 6 o'clock, a. m., rainy,

both in summer and winter. Between 6 and 8 o'clock, a. m., show-

ery in summer and cold in winter.

Between 10 and 12 o'clock, a. m., showery in summer, and cold and windy in winter.

Linseed Tea For Horses.

Linseed tea is not only a valuable restorative for sick horses, but it is exceedingly useful in cases of inflammation of the membranes peculiar to the organs of respiration and digestion; it shields and lubricates the same; tranquilizes the irritable state of the parts, and favors healthy action. We have prescribed linseed tea in large quantities, during the past month, for horses laboring under the prevailing influenza; they seem to de-prive much benefit from it, and generally drank it with avidity. Aside from the benefit we deprive from the action of mucilage and oil, which the seed contains its nutritive elements are of some account especially when given to the animals laboring under soreness in the organs of deglutition, which incapacitates from swallowing more solid food. In the event of an animal becoming prostrated by inability to masticate or swallow more food, linseed tea may be resorted to, and in case of irritable cough, the addition of a little honey makes it still more useful.
