

fruit. acre blocks. These blocks are divided by avenues 42 feet wide, with a central avenue 100 feet wide. The avenues are all named one way and numbered the other, after the plan of the streets of Philadelphia. Each of the four acre blocks is planted with some one variety of fruit, and at the corner of the block is an index board, showing the number of trees, (196 in each block,)kind and date of planting, thus enabling the overseer to direct the workmen to any block or tree on the farm.

Land drainage has been the subject of many remarks spoken and written-all of a favorable character, yet as a system in this country, it has made comparatively but little progress. The time will come, probably, in the remote future, if the physical condition of the world remains If these were accomplished, a much larger area of surface than now would be furnished, its productiveness doubled and its maturity hastened by at least two weeks
