FARM AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

Remedy for Short Hay Crop.

The hay crop is short from one half to one quarter in many parts of country. The unparalleled drouth of last year favored worms, and in many meadows the grass-roots were entirely eaten up.

Good Soups.

Soups, when properly made, are very wholesome and almost indispensable appendage to a good dinner. But how few cooks know how to make it wholesome and palatable.

They think that to be good it must look very yellow, and made so by half an inch in depth of grease on the top. Now the truth is, there should be no grease, if possible, about soup.

A knuckle of veal, boiled in a gallon of water down to a jelly, can, when cold, be cut into pieces and used as "stock" for several days, each time adding as much of the stock as will make sufficient soup for the meal.

How Can I Raise Quinces.

To this question the Germantown Telegraph says that they can be raised as easy as apples or pears, in a way we shall describe. There is no secret about it. Get the "Orange" variety. See that they are entirely free of the borer before planting.

Should the borer by any means steal in, ferret them out with wire. Should they, however, get the advantage of you, and your trees become honey-combed, set out again young trees, so that by the time the old ones are gone the young ones will be finely bearing.

No plant yields anything like as much nutriment from the same extent of soil as the banana. Baron Humboldt estimated that it returns twenty times as much as the potato.
