

Miscellaneous News Items.

The great fires in the West will probably increase the price of lumber.

The Huntingdon county fair realized over \$2,000.

One county in Tennessee brought forth 400,000 bushels of peanuts this season.

The Washington Post-Office has already transmitted money orders to all parts of the world under the new regulations.

An Eastport, Me., despatch reports the mackerel fishing a complete failure, the fisherman having given up fishing.

Several towns in the lumber district of Green Bay have been burned, and it is reported that over twelve hundred persons have perished in the flames.

Mr. Alden Spooner, a farmer in Bethel, Vt., recently carried to Market a load of hops, for which he received nearly \$1,200.

Acting Governor Hanton, of the District of Columbia, has issued a proclamation convening the Legislative Assembly to legalize a loan of \$100,000 for the relief of the Chicago sufferers.

In Albany, the other night, the Rev Mr. Waters while preaching, stopped a few moments and then said: "I am rarely, if ever, annoyed by people talking. I am not to-night; but I am afraid the congregation is." "You could have heard a pin drop" during the balance of the sermon.

A new barn on the farm of Mr. Jonas Stager, about a mile and a half east of Lebanon, near the county almshouse, was entirely destroyed by fire on Tuesday night last, and very soon this whole building and its contents, embracing Mr. Stager's this year's crops, were in a blaze, and soon were ashes.

The barn of Samuel Peachey, of Nenno township, Mifflin county, was burned to the ground, on Wednesday, the 4th inst., with all its contents, among which were three colts belonging to Mr. Peachey, and a valuable horse, the property of a Mr. Yoder. The fire originated from the friction of some of the gearing of a threshing machine.

The Secretary of the Navy has determined to put a stop to the disgraceful habit of hazing at the Naval Academy. He has ordered the dismissal of five cadet midshipmen from the Academy for persisting in this vicious practice against order and regulations. The order says that while mere youthful vivacity and mischief may be overlooked, persistent blackguardism is inconsistent with the character of an officer and gentleman, and will not be tolerated.

About daylight on the morning of the 17th inst., the Fifth ward of Brooklyn was aroused by another raid of revenue officers on the illicit stills in that city. The arrangements for the raid were so complete as to surprise the generally wide-awake whisky men of the fifth ward. The revenue officers were supported by United States troops, and were landed at the foot of Gold street, from which point the raid commenced. They met with but little opposition, and captured several stills and other property.

A little daughter of K. S. Hathaway living at Hartford, recently met with a strange accident. While asleep she arose from her bed, and the supposition is that she sat for a time on the window-sill with her feet hanging out, and from thence slipped and fell to the ground. Her night dress was found hanging to the hook used for fastening the blinds, turned inside out and probably held her for a time, before she slipped through. Although she fell from the third-story window, a distance of thirty or more feet, no bones were broken, but she was badly bruised.

FOREIGN NEWS.

Mr. Lodes, who lately died in London, left his relatives \$75,000,000.

One Province in China has been visited with a terrible flood. The American minister reports that there is 10,000 square miles under water.

A terrific typhoon recently occurred at Kong Kong. Three ships were dismasted and one sunk in the harbor, causing a great loss of life.

Advises from Odessa state that 800 buildings in the town of Bogvosloy have been burned by incendiary fires, believed to be the work of the fanatical oppressors of the Jews. The great proportion of the inhabitants of the town are of Jewish faith.

It is announced that the German troops now in France will evacuate six of the Departments on Nov. 17th.

At Constantinople the cholera, the progress of which was supposed to have been checked, is again spreading with increased violence. Over eighty persons have died within a few days from the epidemic. Many people are leaving the city in consequence of the reappearance of the plague.

The final ratification by France of the treaty with Germany has been dispatched to Berlin.

A terrible famine is devastating portions of Asiatic Turkey. In Bagdad, the capital of one of the Provinces, many deaths have occurred.
