The Market Value of Short Horn Cattle.

The Irish Farmer's Gazette, of recent date gives an account of a sale of sixty-one head of cattle, which averaged £253 each.

A bull brought the astounding sum of £1,732 10s; a calf nine days old, £262 10s; another, two months old, fetched £525; and a cow, £945.

The price of the bull in gold would be over eight thousand dollars, or in currency, about nine thousand five hundred dollars!

Burning Out Chimneys.
