

SIXTY HOURS TO EUROPE.

Professor John Wise, aeronaut, who proposes to cross the Atlantic in a balloon, thereby establishing his theories regarding the currents of the atmosphere and the uses to which they can be put for purposes of travel, is in New York.

Reporter—Is there any doubt but that if the money were supplied the expedition could start this season?

Professor Wise—Not the slightest. Six weeks would be ample sufficient to build the balloon and equip the entire apparatus.

Reporter—Will you be kind enough to give me some general idea of the plan upon which the aerial vessel will be built?

Professor Wise—The balloon itself will be globular in shape. A balloon of 100 feet in diameter is of ample size to cross the ocean, and one of 150 feet would be sufficiently large for the purpose of circumnavigating the globe.

Reporter—What capacity would you have, Professor, for passenger's or mails?

Professor Wise—In a balloon 100 feet in diameter we could take 10,000 pounds of disposable ballast. In the transatlantic trip we should take a good deal of this in the shape of provisions, cooked and canned meats and fruits.

Reporter—By what means, other than from the sun, would you determine your location?

Professor Wise—We should take observations upon the sun with the sextant. We should also employ chronometers and the barometer.

Reporter—The first important observation would be to get the barometric lines of the upper trade winds. These are possibly at a regular level over the ocean, since temperature is more mild below, and no undulations in the surface exist to cause undulations in the air currents.

Reporter—By what means, other than from the sun, would you determine your location?

Professor Wise—We should take observations upon the sun with the sextant. We should also employ chronometers and the barometer.

Reporter—Am I to understand that you will have a line in the water from the car?

Professor Wise—Precisely so. The balance of drag-rope, about 1,000 feet in length, relieves the balloon of weight exactly to the extent of the rope's immersion in the water.

Reporter—Please describe the car in which the passengers will travel.

Professor Wise—We shall have a large wicker-work car, with strong canvas sides and roof to protect us from the weather.

Reporter—What are the possibilities of the future should your trip prove successful?
