I should also state that if no other means offered for ascertaining our direction, we shall have along with us percussion firepots, which, when thrown upon the sea, will ignite, showing their smoke in daylight and their light by night. They will be literally our "pillar of cloud by day and pillar of five by night."" Reporter-Please describe the car in

which the passengers will travel. Protocold Wise-We shall have a targe wicker-work car, with strong canvas sides and roof to protect us from the weather. In this will be glass windows. The car will be of two stories in height. We shall live on the upper floor, and in the lower we shall store our provisions. Underneath the car will be an open gallery for taking observations of the sup. It will be put as far below as practicable, so as to avoid as much as possible the shadow from the halloon. Below the gallery the life boat will be suspended. This will be of metal and decked over. I have thought of taking the little full-rigged vessel Red White, and Bine, as she weighs only 1500 pounds. I have already seen her owner.

Reporter-What are the possibilities of the future should your trip prove successful?

Professor Wise—Everything imaginable in the way of transportation may become possible then. We may be able to discount the stories of Aladdin and the genii. Sailing in the air will have to be learned just as was the naviga-tion of the sea. It look a great many years before men would venture to sea in ships. I should also say that the success of this undertaking will enable us to foretell to a nicery by cable the state of the weather on the British Isles, as the sylones which bring the weather waves will pass us previously.


