To render posts or timber, placed in the ground, practically impervious to moisture, and for a long time prevent decay, the following simple recipe has been tried and found to answer the purpose excellently.

For fence and gate posts it is particularly recommended. Take lincseed oil, boil it, and mix it with charcoal dust until the mixture has the consistency of an ordinary paint.

Give the posts a single coat of the mixture or paint before planting them, and no farmer, says one who has used it, living to the age of the patriarchs of old, will live long enough to see the posts rotten.

The posts should be well-seasoned and dry when the paint is applied.

New Pension Law.

UNDER an act of Congress approved March 3, 1874, widows of officers who were killed, or died of disease contracted in the service, are now entitled to \$2.00 per month for each of their children.

The guardian of a minor child of a soldier who heretofore only received \$3.00 per month pension is now entitled to \$15.00 per month.

Soldiers who receive invalid pensions can now have their pensions increased to any sum or rate between \$5.00 and \$15.00 per month.

Fathers and mothers who lost sons in the service upon whom they were dependent for support, can also obtain pensions.
