Persians. Even patient Job becamo im patient at the dresses, and Isaiah denounces the "women of that period," liv. ing for nothing but dress and flirtation,
with the one desire to "see and bo seen." The tunied worn by the ladies in the
time of Solomon was much like tho polen time of solomon was much like tho polon-
aise of te-day, and the belt with fancy
claspa now worn are abont the same as clasps now woru are about the: same as
the leathor girdles and silver bucklosl worn
of old. We also find recorded that trins were worn to dresses, and that trains hair shawls were common. Embroidered also spoken of. The hair was also oiled, dyed, and put up in coils; little curls, were let havg over the forehead, and, strangelto ay, the girls of Solomon's time, it is stat-
ed, used paint. Veils were worn, and sandals were made
of blue and violet colored leather, with fancy latchets. Solomon, as is related, said to Shulamite, "How beautiful are thy foet with shoes, $O$, prince's daughter "',
Hair nets were worn, and earrings of Hair nets were worn, and earrings of ail
forms and much value were very common. Bracelets on the right arm, strings of Bracelets on the right arm, strings of
pearls and heavy gold chains around the neck, rings on the fingers, and other orna-
ments, were all worn by the ancient He rew ladies.
