by similar corporationa. It sets forth that
the company pays a fair compenastion the company pays a fair compensation for
the time and services of ita employees and in roturn demands that they shall devote
their eutire attention to tho dation of their respective positions. That they are not
act in any executive or other capacity in o
for any other corporation or to give the
. labor to any other firm or business. That
they are not to bo interested in any way directly or indireetly in the supplies or busi and profits acoruing from any such employcompany and not to the employee, and are
to be turned into the treasury of the rail road. In fact the company enters upon
new and enlarged sphere of usefulness

prises in their early ntages. The announce ment of thase facts must have a vastly
