THE Illinois Legislature is divided politically as follows: Senate—Republicans, 30; Democrats, 19; Independent Democrat (Matthew O'Kea), supported by Republicans, 1. Total 50. House—Republicans (regular and Independent), 101; Democrats, 76. Total, 177.

The European muddle is getting more complicated, and it is impossible to predict to what it may lead. There is no telling how wide the war may ultimately spread. Austria, it is said, will immediately take decisive steps, withdraw from the demands of Russia. Public feeling in England is in favor of resisting her demands, even if a resort to arms is necessary. Eng. has undoubtedly lost her prestige in European politics, but allied with France, Italy, Austria and Turkey, she would be a formidable antagonist for both Russia and Prussia combined. Things are evidently deteriorating now.

WAR SUMMARY.—Versailles avices say the position of the Germans has become extremely critical, and alarm prevails among all who understand the situation. The King would return immediately to Berlin, but it was not considered safe to permit him to depart with a very large escort, which could not be spared, as he would be captured or shot by franc-tireurs, who are swarming all over the country. So great are Moltke's apprehensions of the consequences of attacks in force by Trezen, and a simultaneous assault on the part of the Army of the Loire, that entrenchments are now being thrown up in the rear and flanks of the German positions around Paris. It is claimed everything promises a complete turning of the tables, and the other annihilation of the invaders.

Dijon has been recaptured by the Prussians in heavy force.

A report is current that General Von Moltke is seriously ill.

A dispatch from London says: "At a Cabinet Council to day it was resolved to act decisively in regard the Russian complication. War is imminent. Great and popular indignation exists against Russia."

THE STATE CAPITAL.

There are already many visible, unmistakable signs of a more than ordinary strength in progress for the organization of both branches of the legislature. It has two phases.—First, the contest inside the Republican organization; second, the plots and plans and corruptions outside the party, to demoralize, degrade, and destroy any Senator or Representative weak enough to give ear to the discontents of men who are perfectly willing to disrupt the Republican organization in order to advance their own self-interests.

The point of interest to which all eyes are now directed is the organization of the Senate. For six days past we have had rank talk-wing, running scuttily and summarily as trades pass over the railroads which run through Harrisburg, to the effect that the Senate will be addressed by Democrats, the bargain, as it is put forth by certain blatant Democrats, being to secure the Democratic vote for an independent candidate for State Treasurer, in return for which the Democracy are to name all the officers of that body. You understand there is only one Republican majority in the Senate. The suggestion is that a Republican Senator has been secured to accomplish this result. On our task of engaging in this disgraceful business is also confined to the Democracy, who are perfectly willing to make any concession to bring the disgraces and defeat of the Republican party. I am too to confess I doubt every assembly made to show that there will be a recreant Republican to budge away not only his own honor, but to sacrifice the honor and interests of his party and the State. Personally and politically it would be the most disastrous act of which any Republican Senator could be guilty. Viewed in any light, it would be overwhelm the man thus guilty as to render his remaining in the Senate an infamy.
