NAME LAW.—The following extracts from the existing name law will be of great interest to you.

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Wheat new per bushel \$1.35 Rye do do 60 Corn do do 50 Oats do do 25

Cloves per bushel 1.75 Flaxseed do 1.50 Potatoes new do 1.00 Timothy seed do 1.00 Buckwheat do 1.00 Onions do 1.00 Butter per pound 18 Eggs per dozen 14 Tallow per pound 10

Chickens do 1.00 Hens do 1.00 Turkeys do 1.00 Rabbits do 1.00

Persons shall at any time, within three days after the date of the killing of any wild bird, rabbit, or squirrel, or any other animal, be liable to a fine of \$10.
