Issue of Fraudulent Naturalization Papers. Sec 20. If any prothonomy, clock, or the deputy of either, or any other person, shall affix the scal of any court to any naturalization paper, or premit the same to be affixed, or give out, or cause or per-mit such naturalization paper to be given out in blank whereby it may be fraudu-lently used, or furnish a naturalization certificate to any person who shall not have been duly examined and sworn in open court, in the presence of some of the judges thereof, according to the act of Congress, or shall aid in, connive at, or in any way permit the issue of any fraudalent naturalization certificate, he shall be guilty of a misdemenance; or if any one shall fraudulently use any such certificate of naturalization, knowing that it was fraudulently issued, or shall vote or at-tempt to vote thereon, or if any one shall to the or attempt is vote on any certificate of naturalization not issued to him, be shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and either or any of the persons, their aiders or abettors, found guilty of either of the misdemeanors aforesaid shall be fined in a turn not according \$1,000, and imprison. sum not exceeding \$1,000. and imprisoned in the proper penitentiary for a period

not exceeding three years.
SEC. 21.
