

Thanksgiving Proclamation. WASHINGTON, Oct. 29. The following proclamation was promulgated to-day: BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA—A PROCLAMATION.

We are reminded by the changing seasons that it is time to pause in our daily avocations and offer thanks to Almighty God for the mercies and abundance of the year which is drawing to a close.

Now, therefore, recognizing these considerations, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States, do recommend to all citizens to assemble in their respective places of worship on Thursday, the 27th day of November next, and express their thanks for the mercies and favor of Almighty God, and having ascribed all political contentions and all secular occupations, to observe such a day as a day of rest, thanksgiving and praise.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed. Done at the city of Washington this 27th day of October, in the year 1874, and of the independence of the United States the ninety-ninth.

ELECTION.

PENNSYLVANIA STANDS FIRM.

Below we give abridged election news from the different States which voted on Monday and Tuesday, although there is nothing official we give the correct news as near as we possibly can at present.

PENNSYLVANIA.

It is impossible at present to say which way the State has gone—the probabilities are that it has gone Republican by a small majority.

MARYLAND.

The latest news received, would indicate, that the whole Congression delegation elected in Maryland is Democratic.

RHODE ISLAND.

The Republican candidates are elected in the First and Second Congressional districts.

NEW JERSEY.

Up to the hour of going to press we have very little news from New Jersey.

NEW YORK.

Sixty-five election districts of this city give Dem. for Governor, 4121; Tilden, 8888, indicating a Democratic majority in city of 40,000.

MASSACHUSETTS.

The Democrats claim the State for Gaston, and the Republicans are waiting for further returns. So far Tallot is ahead.

MISSISSIPPI.

The election is unusually quiet. There is considerable fall off from the August vote. The Democrats claim a majority of 2,000 in this city.

ALABAMA.

The election passed off quietly. The vote of this city is about 800 less than in 1872, and it is claimed as that much Democratic gain.

LOUISIANA.

The city has probably gone Democratic by 6,000 majority. The Republicans carried the State by 8,000 to 10,000 majority.

FLORIDA.

Returns from Florida are meagre and unsatisfactory. Nothing definite can be obtained to-night. Finley, Dem., is probably elected in the First District.

VIRGINIA.

The whites to-day have polled their average vote in this city, but the colored vote has fallen off greatly. The Conservatives are jubilant and claim an overwhelming victory, many fixing Walker's majority over Burgess, Republican, in Richmond, at 1,500 to 2,000.

KANSAS.

Returns from half precincts in this city show a Conservative vote of 150 over Governor Kemper's vote last November, which vote will be used in making comparisons.

NEVADA.

No returns of a satisfactory character have been received from Nevada. Tickets have been terribly scratched throughout the State. A Virginia City despatch says the returns from all quarters indicate that the Legislature will be in favor of Sharon, Republican, for United States Senatorship.

MICHIGAN.

An unusually heavy vote has been polled throughout the State. The returns show considerable Democratic gain.

DELAWARE.

The returns are still incomplete, but the indications are that all the counties are Democratic. The Democratic candidate for Governor is also elected.

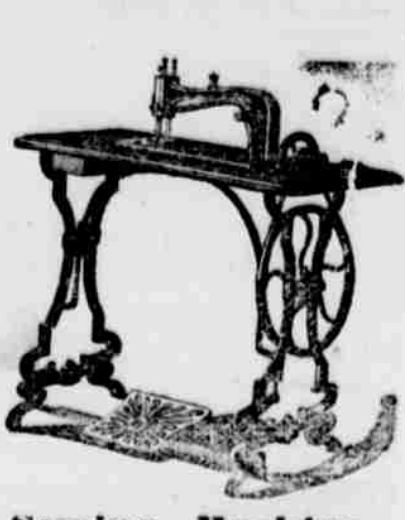
