LETTER FROM ILLINOIS. SADA, Stephenson Co., Ill. PHASED JERR.—I have received a number of different letters from persons in Snyder county requesting me to give a description of the climate, soil, price of land &c., in this county. I have answered nearly all, but if you can find space in your valuable paper, I would be glad to have you publish what I will write to you, who can complete moving west. Prairie farms are selling at from \$10 to \$75 dollars per acre, according to improvements, and uplands are from \$30 to \$50 dollars all within a few miles of depot or elevators. I suppose it would be difficult to find better soil anywhere. There are plenty of fields under cultivation for the last twenty years, producing splendid crops, without ever being manured, but manuring is becoming more fashionable and straw burning less so—the climate is very healthy and the water good limestone. Our winters are pretty much like yours. Last winter however was an exception, whether they ever experienced such a fearful winter before I am unable to say as "the oldest inhabitant" played early in the season; so we have no snow to consult. There is a roller deal of land changing hands this spring; old settlers are going west and their places are almost invariably taken by Pennsylvanians. I think I can safely say that one-half the inhabitants of this county are mannylanders and I think that if our Snyder Co., friends knew what a good county this is for people in general and farmers in particular there would be quite a stir for awhile.

THE SCHOOL EXHIBITION AT BRAVEROWN. Mr. Burton.—Here comes another communication from our little town. This however does not contain as much of the light in it as the one you last received from our quiet village did. From that one we learned that our "good-mature" admirers of degrees of passion. We believe in justice and right, and do make our friends to be excited with our provocation, especially not our school teachers. We appreciate well qualified and faithful teachers, and do not want them either abused, or referred to in a sneering manner. At some places it has become the custom to find fault with the teachers from the time their scholars open until they close, but we want to understand that however we do not belong to that class. We claim that our teachers, G. I. Stahland and John Kaufman, are among the most faithful in the county, and if any other of our towns can boast of better schools than we had, we should like to hear from them.

At the close of last year's school term Mr. Stahland's school gave an entertainment or exhibition, which was very much praised by all who were present and witnessed the performances. Indeed so much pleased were the pupils themselves, that they insisted upon also having one this year. Though we were of the extra amount of labor it would cost to give the part to make it a success, Mr. Stahland did not refuse, but agreed to comply with their wishes. Accordingly, selections were made for speaking and singing, and the evening decided upon. Both teacher and pupils worked hard every day (out of school hours), especially in the evenings. Hard work always merits reward, and we are to be expected to do this. The exhibition was held on the evening of the 30th of last month. On account of the roads, no more unfavorable time could have been selected, but the people of Beavertown and vicinity were not going to miss what all believed it would be—one of the best entertainments of the kind ever given in the county. For an hour and a half the door was to be opened, crowds of people, young and old could be seen making their way towards the church to make sure of seats, and it was well they did so, for when the exercises commenced, the church was crowded, every seat being occupied, notwithstanding that an admission fee was charged. After the exercises it is not too much to say, that, though the expectations of the audience were high, they were fully realized. As expected, the pupils would acquit themselves well, but none believed that they would do so well as they did. There was no hesitation or embarrassment noticeable on the part of any one. They all spoke well and sang well. If my communication were not already too long, I would give you the names of the pupils who participated in the exercises, and also the names of the pieces spoken and sung, but time and space forbid my doing so. Suffice it to say, that it was a grand success, and will long be remembered by the people of our town and community.

Too much praise cannot be given Mr. Stahland for taking the time and going to the trouble required to select and prepare the exercises. They were not however all selected. Some of them were original, and were not in the program for the first time, and if their happy and innocent allusions to a few persons in the audience were enjoyed fully as well as any other part of the programme.
