In pursuance of a resolution of the Republican State Committee, adopted at a meeting held in Harrisburg this day, a Republican state Convention, to be composed of delegates from each Senatorial and Representative district...

The debt statement for January shows a reduction of \$1,599,365.47. A determined effort will be made at the present session of Congress for the abolition of the two-cent stamp on bank checks.

A STATEMENT OF ADJUTANT GENERAL TATTA shows the cost of sending military to suppress the riots in the local regions last spring to be \$200,713.44.

The general appropriation bill reported in the House at Harrisburg, shows members \$1,599 salary, and is accepted as an indication that the session will be prolonged for one hundred and fifty days.

GEO. HALLIDAY has reappointed and the Senate has confirmed, M. S. Quay, Esq., to be Secretary of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The report of Auditor General Temple on the receipts and expenditures of the State Government for the year 1875, shows that the revenue of the Commonwealth from all sources amounting to \$6,480,090, no increase over 1874 of \$604,130.

THE SOLDIERS' ORPHANS' SCHOOLS.—The number of soldiers' orphans who have been admitted to State Soldiers' Orphans' Schools of Pennsylvania since their opening in 1865 has been 7,858, and the cost of sustaining the schools has been \$4,438,229.

MORE APPROPRIATIONS.—This Centennial business is getting to be serious. An appropriation of \$500,000 was obtained from the State on the 15th for the Centennial. But another \$200,000 was demanded and obtained with a similar pledge.

SENATORS BURWELL has again introduced his bill to control the lobby of the two houses of Congress by the organization of a bar. It provides that no person shall be permitted to appear before any committee unless he be admitted to membership of the proposed bar.

ACCORD following from the Philadelphia Times as true, and the clouds are not big with promise of a Democratic shower. It says, the Democratic party may win in its name and under its banner, but not by its own strength.

THE Presidential campaign will be one of the most active in our history. Democracy will not relinquish its foothold upon the House of Representatives, much less its hopes of national control, without a desperate struggle.
