Office was graced on Monday by a call from Miss Smith and Miss Cramer, of Reading, visiting in this place.

We learn that Rev. Kendall, Lutheran Minister, at this place, has resigned his charge to take effect after the 1st of August.

A correspondent from Adamsburg informs us that a small son of John Gilbert whilst passing through a field on the 5th inst., was struck by a copper head. Dr. Smith attended to the wound, and the boy is getting along finely.

The township officers of Penn township met on the 5th inst., and audited the accounts for the year ending April 30, 1876. Mr. Henry Moyer was elected Clerk to the Auditors, which position he has held for the last 17 years.

Mr. Moyer has in his possession an account book of the twp., for the year 1785. At that time, payments were made with "English money" instead of dollars and cents.

Fred Miller and Peter Witmer were the Supervisors for the year 1785. The book was neatly kept, in a good hand writing, and in a business like manner.

Francis Augustus Boyer, Sr. (From the Freeburg Courier.) Francis Augustus Boyer, Sr. was born in Limerick township, Montgomery county, Pa., on the 9th day of July, 1793. He was a son of Phillip Boyer and his consort Elizabeth, whose name was Nunkgesser. In his early infancy he was baptized, and his sponsors were Francis Swain and his wife Mary. In his youthful days he attended catholic instructions, and was received into full communion with the Lutheran church, by Rev. Vineland He entered into the bonds of matrimony with Agnes Zell, who died March 27, 1855, aged 79 years, 3 months and 12 days, and whose remains rest beside those of our departed father.

His family consisted of three sons and three daughters, who all preceded him to the eternal world, except his daughter Caroline, intermarried with Isaac D. Boyer, who alone survives her father and who performed many acts of kindness and attention during his sickness, and proved by her attention the spirit of a faithful daughter.

The deceased enjoyed good health for many years, until on Good Friday 1875, he slipped on an icy board and fell. On Monday following he was unable to walk, his left side seemed paralyzed. Since that time he was confined to the house. Sitting in his chair unable to move except with the assistance of others. The last two weeks of his life he was a great sufferer, which he bore with christian resignation. When his sufferings were greatest he told those around him that his Saviour had suffered more than he did. In his last hours he requested those around him to sing to him. When the old familiar hymn "In which he attempted to join" he sang: "Es ist gewisslich an der Zeit, his spirit took its flight, and we have every reason to believe that place where he can join in singing the song of Moses and the Lamb in the Paradise of Song. During his sickness he received the kindest attention at the hands of Susan Boyer, widow of Francis A. Boyer, Jr., with whom he lived. At all hours of the day and night, with the tenderness of a daughter, she ministered to his wants. He died May 24, 1876, aged 85 years, 10 months, and 15 days. When the toll and stately form of "Uncle Frank," as he was called by nearly every one, failed to appear in public as usual, a feeling of sadness prevailed for he was sociable, entertaining and enjoyed the society of those around him. The many visitors from far and near during his sickness show the esteem in which he was held. He filled various positions of trust: He was one of the first auditors of our county, in connection with Henry W. Snyder, son of Ex-Governor Snyder, and Hon. Ner Middlesworth—names familiar as household words to the citizens of this county.—He was recorder and administrator of different estates and his counsel and his advice was sought and considered valuable. He was what we can truly call an honest man, the noblest work of God. In his earlier days he was an intimate friend of ex-Governor Shunk, of whom he had great pleasure in speaking and relating incidents that occurred in their younger days.

He contributed freely of his means to the support of the Gospel, and wherever a demand was made of a collection held for the benevolent institutions of the church his full share was cheerfully given.

We will miss him as a good citizen, a counsellor, a sociable affable gentleman. Another of the good old fathers has gone to his reward, and his works do follow him. He was followed to his grave on Saturday last, May 27, by a large circle of friends and acquaintances. Rev. E. L. Reed, of the Lutheran church, preached a suitable and edifying discourse from the words and in II Tim. 1c. 12v: "I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day." Rev. W. A. Haas, of the Reformed church, officiated in German language. He lived his life on the words of Isaiah 60: "Thy sun shall no more go down, neither shall thy moon be hid; for the Lord shall be thy light, and the Lord shall be thy glory."

From his intimate acquaintance with the deceased he was enabled to speak in very acceptable manner of the many virtues which adorned the life of the departed father. His last words were: "I have done my duty, and now I go to my Father."

The Experimental Trip. The fast train furnished by the Pennsylvania Railroad Co., which passed Lewistown on Thursday morning at 6:38, left Jersey City at one o'clock a. m., furnishing us with a copy of the New York Herald of that morning, less than seven hours after being printed. It arrived in Altoona at 8:15, and at Pittsburgh two minutes ahead of time, after a continuous run of 444 miles without a stop, thus accomplishing a feat of transportation without parallel or precedent in the history of the world.

The Alleghenies were crossed with a single engine at a speed of 35 miles an hour, the minimum speed having been 25 miles an hour; maximum, 62 miles an hour, and the average speed 44 miles an hour. A sumptuous breakfast was served in the Pullman hotel car between Tyrone and Galitzin, and was enjoyed in perfect comfort with the train running at a rate of 50 miles an hour. Crowds of people at the various stations witnessed the passage of the train with demonstrations of satisfaction at its prompt appearance. Its slowest speed on the Pennsylvania was in going through cities and towns, 25 miles per hour.

The train arrived at Chicago at 10 o'clock on Thursday night, and passed station after station ahead of time at a speed varying from 32 per hour on the up grades of the Rocky Mountains, to over 70 miles on the level prairies, arriving at the end of Oakland wharf, which is within the city limits of San Francisco, at 9:25 o'clock a. m., on Sunday morning, twenty-six minutes less than eighty-four hours; arrived at the wharf at 9:40 a. m., and at 9:52 the passengers alighted in the court of the Palace Hotel, in good health and spirits.—Lewistown Gazette, 6th inst.
