Custer's Last Battle. How it is Described by the Only Survivor.

A correspondent writes from Bismark to the New York Herald a letter from which we extract the following: "The Crow Indian Curley is believed to be the only survivor of the 250 men who went into action with Custer."

The General, he says, kept down the river on the north bank, four miles after Reno had crossed to the south side above. Custer's object was to cut off the Indians.

The Indians met him and poured in a heavy fire from across the narrow river. Custer dismounted to fight on foot, but could not get his skirmishes over the stream.

Custer then fell back to some high ground behind him and seized the ravines in his immediate vicinity. The Indians completely surrounded Custer and poured in a terrible fire on all sides.

Custer again and again driven back. The fight began about two o'clock and lasted, Curley says, almost until the sun went down over the hills. The men fought desperately, and after the ammunition in their belts was exhausted, went to their saddles-bags for more, and continued the fight.

Custer was wounded, and went about encouraging his soldiers to fight on. He got a shot in the left side and sat down with his pistol in his hand. Another shot struck Custer in the breast and he fell over. The last officer killed was a man who rode a white horse (believed to be Lieutenant Cook, adjutant of the 7th, as Lieutenant Cook and Calhoun were the only officers who rode white horses).

Custer was hopelessly surrounded he watched his opportunity, got a Sioux blanket, put it on, and worked up a ravine, and when the Sioux charged he got among them and they did not know him from one of their own men.

Custer was killed, as they were outnumbered five to one and apparently dismounted. These men were no doubt part of the thirty-five missing men reported in the official despatches of Gen. Terry. Curley says he saw one cavalry soldier who had got away. He was well mounted but shot through both hips, and Curley thinks he died of his wounds, starved to death in bad lands, or more likely his trail was followed up and killed by the Sioux.
