WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 15, 1876. Index of Sentiments of Married Reformers. Unfranchise? Not Good but Sloganeering.—Tilden's Strictly Confidential Circular.

As an index of the sentiment of Maryland "reformers" regarding law and order, a score of men proceeded on the evening of the 27th ult., on Deal's Island, to the home of James Jones, "knocked him down, tied his hands and feet, tore off his clothing, stamped on him, and pretended that he was committing an outrage on one Julia Sommers;" without a warrant then made him walk thus manacled over two miles to one Justice Webster's where after a mock trial, they demanded a commitment which was improperly granted, when they carried him to Princess Ann, twenty miles distant, with a rag or lousened hand to protect himself from the manacles, and placed him in jail, where he was confined until the 21st inst., when Capt. W. S. Dix seized his bail; the said Julia A. Sommers affirmed that "said Jones had not misbehaved to her, and that she had no reason for appearing either before a grand or other jury against him." There is no record in that section, for the Democrats talk very fluently about taking their guns and killing every negro on that island, and say that no negro shall vote on that island.
