The certainty of continued Republican rule for four more years tells on the gold premium. The decision of the Florida case brought it down below any former quotation; that of Louisiana tumbled it to 104 7/8. And the twisting of Cronin's nose will pretty near bring greenbacks to par.

Preparations for the inauguration of President Hayes are actively going on in Republican circles, while the Democrats are busily appointing a Cabinet for him. It seems to us the work the Republicans are at in both more legitimate and less important than that attempted by the 'Cops.

The Electoral Commission on Friday, by a unanimous vote, rejected the Cronin certificate from Oregon, and by a strict party vote declared that the Hayes electors carried the State. This gives Hayes a majority of the electors—the three disputed States have been declared by the commission to have gone Republican.

Gen. Sherman, it is stated, denies the report that he intends to resign his position in the United States Senate, for the purpose of having his son Don elected. He says that if his health is as good two years hence as it is now, he expects to be a candidate for re-election to the Senate. There is plenty of game yet in the "old man," and he intends to die in the harness.

The sum total of railway lines through the principal countries of the world now reaches a distance of nearly fourteen times the circumference of the globe, or one and a half times a journey to the moon. Of this total the United States lines extend 75,585 miles; Great Britain's at home and through her foreign domain, 66,011; Russia's in Europe and Asia, 31,914; those of France 30,770; and of the German Empire 18,897.

A BILL has been introduced in the House of Representatives to punish improper assemblies upon the public streets, providing that any three persons who shall remain for a quarter of an hour in front of any public house or church, and shall engage in profane, obscene or loud talk or in making indecent or abusive remarks, or in obstructing the highway shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. The passage of this bill would meet with the general approval of all respectable and law-abiding citizens, and there are few places, if any, in which it would not be beneficial.

It is announced from Washington that the subject of outrages upon American citizens on the Mexican borders of the Rio Grande by the revolutionists is occupying the attention of our Government, and that orders will soon be sent to our army and naval forces in that quarter with a view to their protection, as there is now no Government in Mexico to which an appeal can be made for that purpose. As regards to the Indian marauders who cross into Texas, the question is likely to be brought to the attention of Congress whether outrages on American citizens shall be permitted to continue, or whether this Government shall take into its own hands the manner of redress.

Our Washington Letter.

WASHINGTON, D. C. Feb. 21, 1877. The disintegration so long threatening Bourbonism and which could have been deferred for four years perhaps, had there been a Tilden victory, is already perceptible under the Haas condition of the political atmosphere. From many negative and not a few positive indications, the belief here has become general that Hayes will number among his supporters many progressive men of the South heretofore acting with the reactionary Democracy, the discontent of many years growth at their unnatural alliance with a party that has brought only evil to their section, having crystallized into absolute contempt for the Tilden leadership because of their duplicity, unblushing disregard of the most solemn pledges, relative to the Florida and Louisiana decision of the majority of the Electoral Commission. No intelligent Southern man conversant with the treachery of the democratic tricksters towards them after their States had been dragged and hounded into the vortex of rebellion in 1860 and 1861, can fail to regard the unfortunate return of their leading men to Democracy after the close of the war with feelings other than those of humiliation. For thirty years prior to the struggle that brought devastation and wide spread ruin to all the fair territory south of the Potomac, the Tammany leaders with a cunning and adroitness rivaling those of the serpent in the garden of Eden, had plotted to bring about a rupture with the Government for purposes of self aggrandizement; and when they had so far beguiled the South as to induce her to commit the overt act on assurance of a safe position in the rear of the Union armies, insulting and taunting their dupes for their childish credulity. But retreat was then impossible, and while they fought through four hopeless years, the mercenaries who tempted them to their fall, waxed rich and prosperous through a war inaugurated for that very purpose. These are among the reasons underlying this movement of withdrawal from the shattered and impotent organization which is hopelessly bankrupt in principles and influence. The bearing of many Southern men during two years of great temptation since their return to Congress has secured them the good will and commendation of their political opponents; and their patriotic course in the two recent Democratic caucuses, restraining the revolutionary element under command of Tilden's chief, Field, has insured such of them as will come honestly seeking the perpetration of an equal republicanism a hearty welcome as equals in the great work of restoring the country to prosperity without any sectional partiality or prejudices. In this connection I just mention one of a thousand rumors already relative to Hayes Cabinet, to the effect that one at least of the representative men of the South will have a position in it. There is a movement afoot—how strong I don't know—to reserve it as a place for a representative of the West, and the names of Sargent and McCormick, both of whom—having been mentioned as acceptable to the Republican sentiment of those youthful but enterprising and energetic States and Territories. Since the substitution of Horace Porter, as administrator of the Treasury Department, the former gentleman has won golden opinions, not only at home among the business men and large capitalists irrespective of politics but among the financiers of Europe and elsewhere as well, and the ex-progressive proposition were made to attack and commercial interests of the Government; and I am persuaded that I but give expression to the almost uniform preference of leading men gathered here from every constituency in the country in relation to the subject, that he may be retained in his present position.
