The Prohibitionists of this State are called to meet at Harrisburg on the 12th day of September, to nominate a State ticket.

Pittsburg journals will not admit that the Philadelphia troops killed in Pittsburg "perished in the attempt to save the city from the mob."

Hon. HENRY M. HOYT, Chairman of the Republican State Committee, had a leg broken by the upsetting of a stage, at Denver, Colorado, on the 21st ult.

The tobacco crop of Lancaster county looks very promising, and the yield is expected to exceed that of last year, which was valued at over \$3,000,000.

The wheat crop in Minnesota this year is said to be magnificent and will be the largest and finest crop ever known in that State. It is estimated at 37,000,000 bushels.

It is said information has been lodged against one hundred and fifty persons who are supposed to have been concerned in the recent riotous demonstrations at Wilkesbarre.

Some speculators in New York have 350,000,000 pounds of that useful commodity on their hands, with a prospect of being compelled to unload at a heavy loss.

About 8,000 miners in the Lehigh region struck for higher wages on the 19th inst. The prospects are that the men will resume work in a few days at the old wages. So far there has been no violence.

The action of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad company in presenting a bill to the government for carrying troops is regarded by many persons and papers as "the cheekiest performance connected with the strike troubles."

Establish military posts in all of the riotous districts until the people there can govern themselves. It was a dose that was given to the South. Now that we need it in the North, let us take it without a crooked face.

The number of killed in the railroad war are reported as follows: Reading 10, wounded 23; Buffalo 1, wounded 13; Baltimore, 9, wounded 63; Chicago 26, wounded 15; San Francisco 12; Saratoga 4.

MR. VANDEBILT has ordered that \$100,000 be distributed among the 11,000 employes of the New York Central on account of their loyalty to the Company, and he promises an increase of pay as soon as the business of the road justifies it.

PRESIDENT HAYES is changing his programme of recreation. It is now thought he will not devote as much time as was at first contemplated to his northern tour, and will entirely abandon that to the South. The pressing nature of public business is argued as a reason for this change.

What the country most needs just now is a little enterprise on the part of the rich. Those who can afford it should make work for those who need it. Poor men cannot bring good times. The rich must grease the wheels of industry, and trust to labor to keep them in motion.

CLEMENT M. BIDDLE has retired from the presidency of the Permanent Exhibition Company in Philadelphia, and John S. Morton, president of the Market-street Railway Company, has been appointed his successor. It is ordered also that hereafter the Exhibition shall be open on Sundays.

They arrested a persistent tramp at Bellefonte recently, and he confessed to the tricks of the trade to get off. He admitted that they put marks upon houses to guide those who followed them, and said that the stone house a few doors below had a mark upon it. The house referred to was Governor Curtin's, and the vagabond pointed out the tramp mark on a post which, he said meant, "A good place for a square meal."

The Losses by the Strike.

The loss by strike and obstruction to business for five days on the five trunk lines of railway, including the destruction of the property of the Baltimore & Ohio and Pennsylvania Railroads, is estimated at \$25,250,000. The New York Journal of Commerce reaches the result in this wise: Taking as a basis the cost to the railroads resulting from the suspension of traffic, an average of \$10,000 per day to each of the five, makes the total \$200,000; add \$50,000 as a low calculation for the losses by interruption of other roads, and the total is \$250,000 per day, or \$1,250,000 for the five days' suspension. The losses sustained by the Pennsylvania at Pittsburg and on the line between that city and Harrisburg are calculated at \$10,000,000. Half of that amount would scarcely cover the cost of property destroyed on the Baltimore & Ohio, and it is likely that \$10,000,000 would approximate losses to railroad property other than those which have been enumerated. This makes a total of \$26,250,000. The losses sustained by the community at large are almost incalculable, embracing the destruction of perishable freight and live stock, the detention of passengers, the support of militia and special officers summoned to preserve the peace, inconvenience attending tardy mails, increased cost of living consequent upon the advance in prices of provisions, augmented taxation, and, perhaps, the bankruptcy of corporations which might otherwise have been averted.

WILLIAM CAMERON, Esq., the brother of General Cameron, is lying seriously ill at his residence in Lewisburg, with cancer in the face. Mr. Cameron's extreme age—being eighty-four years old—may act as a detriment to any treatment for the relief of this painful and dangerous malady, which requires the accompaniment of a robust constitution. But there is still hope that the disease may be arrested, and that he who has been a benefactor in his neighborhood, a public-spirited and active citizen in his borough, and a faithful and liberal friend to the needy, may be spared to the community he has seen grow up around him.

The increased exportation of grain from south-eastern Europe is believed in London to be only temporary. Great losses have been experienced, particularly in Turkey, by a failure to properly harvest the crop, and reports already have been received from the scene of the recent famine in Asia that famine stares the population in the face. In view of these facts there is reason to believe that the demand for American grain, now temporarily reduced by the active competition of grain from the Black Sea region, will in the end be increased on account of the Eastern war.

Sowing and Reaping.—For many years we have been cultivating the spirit of Communism in these United States. The inflationists have tried to rob creditors; the Grangers have tried to rob transporting companies; the Trades Unions have tried to rob men willing to work at lower rates. We have sown the seed and cultivated it to maturity, and now we are having a harvest. No man can tell how many millions it will cost us before that spirit which is at war with all civilized society can be subdued.—N. Y. Tribune.

The Republican State Convention of Maine met last Thursday. Sel den Connor was nominated for Governor. A resolution endorsing President Hayes, after the manner of the Ohio Republican Convention, was offered, but it was rejected, and the convention simply said nothing for or against the policy of Mr. Hayes. Mr. Blaine was chiefly instrumental in influencing the convention to adopt the say-nothing policy as the course of President Hayes.

There is nothing that more strikingly shows the general stagnation in business and enterprise pervading our country than the little responsible demand for money. It is now difficult for persons having capital to invest to find a safe place for it, and there is \$66,000,000 of the money of individuals and corporations lying idle in the U. S. Treasury vaults, on which no interest is paid.—Lebanon Courier.

The Louisville Courier Journal says the State tax will be extremely odious in Pennsylvania next year. As there is no State tax levied in Pennsylvania, and as there has been none such since the Democrats were driven out of power in the State, save the tax on corporations, it may be safely said the Courier Journal is a little "fused in its mind."

A GREENBACK labor party at Pittsburg was organized on Saturday a week. Among the resolutions adopted was one preventing corporations from paying laborers less than \$1.50 a day. Another resolution provides that prison labor, contract or otherwise, be abandoned. The greenback party intends putting a county ticket in the field.

PRESIDENT HAYES, in depriving the Indians of fire-arms and ammunition, has taken a step in the right direction in dealing with the devilish savages. If persisted in, he will soon put a stop to Indian wars, and as the Philadelphia Times has well said, "break up a profitable branch of the Indian Agency business."
