Very few persons are aware that there are eight United States mints in this country, located as follows: Philadelphia; Charlotte, North Carolina; Dahlburg, Georgia; San Francisco; Carson City, Denver, Dallas City, Oregon, and New Orleans. Some of them coin only gold and several have not for some years been in operation.

The Hon. Benjamin F. Wade, ex-Governor of the United States from Ohio, died on the morning of the 13th inst., aged 73 years. Mr. Wade has long been prominent in the politics of the country, and was one of the ablest and most reliable friends of the Union in the United States Senate, during the troublous times of the war, and the period immediately preceding it.

The arrival of emigrants in Kansas are said to be large beyond precedent. On Thursday a week, over twelve hundred persons arrived at Atchison, and on the same day twenty-seven car loads reached Topeka on one road alone. A good many of these are only on a tour of observation, and many who think they have gone to remain, will return in the fall.

Many years ago a young man, a native of North Carolina, was traveling on his way west, and was distinguished by a carriage in his carriage. Letter From Harrisburg

Harrisburg, March 13, 1878.

The weather is very much improved, and will bring the season to an exceptional winter and spring. For the past week or two, the streets are dry and dusty, and vegetation is in an unusually far advanced state; blue birds and robins are as fresh as in May and the air is soft and balmy as in the month of June. What a contrast the social and political world affords! Financial convulsions; religious controversy; political anarchy!

The event of the week has been the development of an alleged "crookedness" in the Auditor's Department of the State, by which upwards of \$100,000 have been lost to the State. It looks much like a "tempus in a tempus," and except a few of \$100,000 obtained by Messrs. Simonton & Olmsted, two Harrisburg Attorneys, I can see nothing absolutely wrong, except a 100 per cent. fraud in the eyes of the law. The part played by Simonton & Olmsted is remarkable, but they will get away with their swag. Simonton, I understand will be a candidate for President Judge, to succeed the Hon. J. Pearson, when the people will have an opportunity of expressing their appreciation of a man who would take \$100,000 of the State taxes, for a letter and a trip to Pittsburg.

Legislation is dragging its slow length along—no allusion to snakes—indeed it is impossible to make progress with the unwieldy body. How we must continue to deplore the tardiness of the New Constitution. But still, the State has not that in it, for she was the banner county in its hostility to the adoption of that outrageous batch of so-called organic laws.

Most faults found for the apparatus of education in the Republican majority in both houses, it is without doubt the principal responsibility.

Union county has an able and dignified representative in the person of the Hon. Alfred Hayes. The contrast between the present and the former Member, Mr. Wolfe, is most striking.
