The placards, announcing the sale of the place at auction, are still fresh on the walls as if they had been stuck up but yesterday; but the beautiful garden is overrun with weeds, and the plaster is scaling off the walls, leaving ugly large blotches of the bare stone exposed.

Let us return from Malmaison, so rich in sad memories, by way of Boulogne, and look, in passing, at the spot where Henry Regnault, the Communist leader, was killed in '71 by a shell from Mount Valerien.
