Home And Farm Conveniences.

In this erticle I wish to calliatter tion to the kitchen and the appli ar cos with which the farmer's will dore ber work. It is perhaps within the Londs of truth to say that a majori'y of farmers' wives do their work slove, and may be said to aimes spent their lives in the kitchen.

Two other propositions are un doubtedly true : 1st. That the woman who does the work for a family al n is almost invariably overworked and 21, that in most houses a little planning and a small on lay would greatly lighten her labor. To show the necessity of every help and conventance which can be afforded, it is legitimate to look at the duties o the farmer's wire. He daily dutiekeep her employed from early tillate, for her husband must have ap corly breakfast, and the necessary cooking, dishwashing, sweeping, and bedmaking, she alone must do. Then there are the extras, such as washing, ironing mending and making, butchering, house cleaning, the extra cooking for harvesters, thrash ers, etc., and if she is raising a fam. ily, the constant care of the children She must be ready to soothe every sorrow, settle every quarrel, tie up the cut fingers, answer the ten thousand questions which childhood can invent, and in addition to this the care of her babe at night when teething, and her children through whosping cough, measles, and all their childish ailments, must come upon the mother. This picture is not overdrawo, and it certainly should convince every one that the farmer can haer no excuse-but extrems poverty-for neglecting to provide his wife with everything which will lighten her labor. Her kitchen should be a well lighted, well vontilated, comfortable room, and on a level with it and as convenient as possible to it, should be wood and water. To make a wood and water. To make a woman go twenty or thirty yards, and perhaps down two or three rickety steps, for every localities. Particulars and a imples worth armful of wood or bucket of water she must use, is positively cruel, and will often prove the 'last' which breaks the woman's health. All her arrangements for extra work should be as complete as possible, and she should be granted every reasonable desire and be allowed to arrange everything In her domain, as best pleases her. If she wants a cupboard moved, or a shelf put up, don't grumble and say 'I don't see why it won't do as well where it is, or ,I haven't time and 1 guess you can do without it. If you do, your wife is not going to wear 1853. you out asking for it, perhaps, but will just wear herself out. She can not, however, make you as happy or feel the same love and respect for you that she would if her reasonable requests were ganted, and her strength less exhausted. Suppose moving the cupboard will take a half hour of your precious time when you are tired and hurried-what of it? By doing it you save your wife perhaps four steps every time she visitsit, which will average ten times for each meal, and this makes one hundred and twenty steps a day. It will cost you twenty-five dollars to make a cistern and put a pump in it so that it will be on a level with the kitchen door and within three steps HARDWARE, of the stove, but that is cheaper than doctor bills, or funeral expenses, and far better than to have your children left metherless when they most need a mother's care.

My space will not allow me to go into details as to what should be found in a modern kitchen, but if the wife is consulted and you give her to understand that you will do for her saything that will lighten her labors. you will be likely to find her both reasonable and greatful. It is the extra labor which breaks down a woman's Selinegrove, Sept. 23, 75. strength and by careful attention to little arrangement as will take the least amount of labor, her life may be made much more comfortable.

I wish our farmers' wives would take up this matter of 'household conveniences' in their department of THE FARMER and tell us what arrangements they have for saving steps and lightening their labors.

Relief For The Children.


