The attending surgeon was prevailed on to attempt reuniting the second finger.

HAIL STORM.—The hail storm which several days ago passed over a portion of West Perry township, this county and extending westward through the valley toward the Juniata river reached as far as McAllesterville. The track of the storm was about a mile wide and well defined by broken window-glass and crops cut down to the ground. the oil men successfully combatted all efforts to tax oil.

The first bill is put down as a pet of the Railroad, and it had the effect on the oil men of a red flag upon the bovine. Your member, the Hon. Charles Miller, passed through the crucible, and came out as gold tried by fire. He was honored at the opening of the session by being one of the three who composed the important committee to apportion the official positions; he served on the important committee of accounts as Chairman, and was acting on the committees on Agriculture, Pensions and Statistics.

But the citizens of Snyder county, and indeed of the Commonwealth, owe him a debt of gratitude for the enactment of the new fish law, which was passed mainly by his efforts. How this was done may never be known unless I relate a recent history known only to a few. Seeing the apparent hopelessness of the cause of the fishermen, two meetings were held at the instance of Mr. Miller, presided over by the Hon. Charles Miner, of Luzerne, with the Hon. John E. Barrett, as Secretary. These faithful friends successfully engineered the interests of the fishermen to the final enactment of the law, the full text of which I enclose herewith, and will be found in another column. The bill is the report of a conference Committee, of which the Hon. Simon P. Wolcott, of Sunbury, was Chairman, through whom Mr. Miller's bill was incorporated as the report of the Committee, and it was passed finally as it came from this Committee. All honor is especially due to these gentlemen for the success of this great measure, so vital to the thousands of the oppressed fishermen along the fishing waters. It will be seen the Governor is authorized to appoint three additional members of the Board of Fishery Commissioners, and for Mr. Miller's indefatigable efforts in this matter it would be but just that Snyder county should have one of these Commissioners.

I set down mainly to award due praise to your worthy member, and will close by simply asking that the fishermen see to it that they reap the rewards that are possible under this tardy though liberal and promising legislation in their behalf.
