Hon. Samuel Butler.

Hon. Samuel Butler, the Republican nominee for State Treasurer, was born in Uchering township, Chester county, on February 2, 1825. His grandparents and parents belonged to the original settlers of the county. He is a brother of Hon. William Butler, Judge of the United States District Court of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Mr. Butler was educated at Unionville Academy, Chester county, and after graduating taught school there for several years. He subsequently removed to Butler county, Ohio, where he also taught school. In 1850 Mr. Butler returned to Chester county, and has since that time resided here. He is a high esteem by the residents of Chester county, and has been nearly all the local township officers, and was director of the poor from 1859 to 1863. He was elected a representative in the Legislature for the session of 1876-77 and 1877-78, and was re-elected, the constituents with one second term, and he was elected to the same position for the third time, and he was elected to the same position for the fourth time. YELLOW FEVER.

Memphis, Tenn., August 1.—The new cases of yellow fever were reported to the Board of Health this morning. Two deaths have occurred since last night. The last case occurred on the Louisville and Nashville Railroad last night. No male were reported last night. The mortality has been reported by the Board of Health this afternoon. The local arrival of deaths from yellow fever according to the official announcement of the Board of Health, for the week ending at 4 o'clock tonight are 23. Last week the total number of deaths from yellow fever was 24. Physicians are sanguine that the mortality death rate has been reduced, and a decrease in the number of deaths may reasonably be expected. A dispatch from New York this afternoon.
