Wunderly, Esq., of Union county was admitted to practice in the several courts of Snyder county. Auditors' Reports in assigned estate of C. K. Fisher, Henry Moyer, Peter Hartman, Killian Rothermel, C. L. Darr, Henry Bender, Simon W. Eyer, confirmed and filed. Orders of Sale awarded in Assigned estates—Henry Brouse, Isaac Hommel, Benjamin Bender, William Kelley, Isaac Barber, Samuel Werline. Assignee Accounts confirmed and filed Z. S. Keely of Newton Staley, T. J. Smith, Esq., of S. B. Simler, J. C. Kreitzer of Wm. Hoffman, P. Harman of W. G. Lutz, Wm. Harding of Fred. Keenling, H. E. Miller of Snyder county Bank.

Allen Ulrich, Ejectment, Verdict for defendant. Solomon Hummel agt. David Meiser, Slender, Plaintiff after Jury sworn, asks leave to amend pleadings—left, pleads surprise and plea, to pay costs of Terza. John Freed and others Administrators of Abraham Freed, dec'd, agt. W. A. Meeker, J. W. Gaugler, Augustus Springman and The Selingsrove & North Branch R. R. Co. Debt. Verdict for plaintiff. Benjamin Brosius agt. Perry Township, Plaintiff. This was an action brought by Bond, Brosius against the Township of Perry, to recover damages for injuries sustained by plaintiff in crossing a foot-log over the Mahoning creek on the line dividing Perry and Chapman townships, which was maintained and kept up by them jointly. A defective joint-log on the Perry twp. side, was used in the erection of the foot-log. It was shown that the supervisors knew of the unsafe condition of the foot-log and neglected to obstruct travel over it as required by law—it was defended by an effort to show that plaintiff knew of the unsafe condition of the log, and that there were within a half mile and one mile distant county and foot bridges over which plaintiff could have safely passed, but the Jury found for the plaintiff a verdict for \$475.
