Curing Hams—To 6 gallons of water and 9 pounds of salt—half coarse, half fine—3 ounces of saltpeter, 3 pounds of brown sugar, 1 pint of molasses, 1 heaping tablespoonful of saleratus. Boil all together, and skim. Let it stand till cold, then pour over the hams, which have been rubbed with a little fine salt and packed in a barrel. Let them lie in the brine five or six weeks, after which drain and smoke.

The same preparation is used for pickling beef. A pork barrel will answer for pickling beef, but after being once used for this purpose, must never again be employed as a pork barrel. Many losses occur from ignorance of this fact. A Dry Pickle.—Those who have only a few hams to cure, or lack barrels for holding brine, will find the following method nearly as good as the other: For 150 pounds of meat, take 1 1/2 ounces of saltpeter, 1 quart of fine salt, with enough molasses to make a paste. Rub well with this mixture on the flesh side; let the hams lie four weeks then; smoke two days. Remove from the smokehouse and paint with black pepper and strong vinegar. After this, place them in paper sacks to secure from flies.

Facts About Flour.—Flour is peculiarly sensitive to atmospheric influences, hence it should never be stored in a room with sour liquids, nor articles that taint the air of the room in which it is stored. Any small perceptible to the sense will not become in contact with grain or other substances that are liable to heat. Flour should be sifted and the particles thoroughly disintegrated and then warmed before baking. The treatment improves the color and baking properties of the dough. The sponge should be prepared for the oven as soon as the yeast has performed its mission, otherwise fermentation sets in and acidity results.

Important to Farmers.—The following recipes for the prevention and cure of hog cholera are given by Mr. J. Ferrell of Middleburg, Cumberland county, to the Star of the Valley for the benefit of farmers throughout the State: Sulphur, 2 lbs.; black antimony 1 lb.; saltpeter, 1 lb.; arsenic, 2 oz. Mix with soap and feed freely.

And the following as a preventive to the disease: 1 peck of wood ashes; 4 lbs. salt, 1 lb. black antimony, 1 lb. copperas, 1 lb. saltpeter, Pound and mix thoroughly; molasses enough to prevent waste. Put in a trough in a dry place where the hogs can eat all that they wish of it as they please. It predisposes to cholera they will eat it freely.

I have known severe cases almost wholly cured in ten minutes by this simple remedy. A friend finds it the great relief in cases of "trane" cold, the cold symptoms entirely leaving the eyes and nose after one thorough washing of the hair. The hair should be thoroughly dried afterward, and avoid draughts of air for a little while.

To avoid catching cold, accustom yourself to the free use of cold water every morning on first getting out of bed. It should be followed by a good deal of rubbing with a wet towel. It has considerable effect in giving tone to the skin and maintaining a proper action in it and thus proves a safeguard to the injurious influence of cold and sudden change of temperatures.
