

Farm, Home &c.

Keep water in the oven, will prevent bread, cakes, etc., from turning.

Fine tooth Powder.—Powdered ovis root one ounce; Peruvian bark one ounce; prepared chalk, one ounce; myrrh, one-half ounce.

Freckles.—Marine of ammonia, half drachm; lavender water, two drachms; rain water, half a pint. Applied with a sponge two or three times a day.

No Egg Cake.—Two and half cups of flour, half a cup each of butter and milk, one and a half cups of brown sugar, and a teaspoonful of soda. Flavor with nutmeg.

Cut or Bruise.—Apply the moist surface of the inside coating or skin of the shell of a raw egg. It will adhere to itself, leave no scar, and heal without pain.

To Give a Stone a Fine, Brilliant Appearance.—A teaspoonful of pulverized alum mixed with stove polish will give the stone a fine luster, which will be quite permanent.

Grease Spots.—An ounce of pulverized borax, put into a quart of boiling water and bottled for use, will be found invaluable for removing grease spots from woolen goods.

Corns.—Boil a potato in its skin, and after it is boiled take the skin and put the inside of it to the corn and leave it on for about twelve hours; at the end of that period the corn will be nearly cured.

Rice Eaters.—Take one cup of cold boiled rice, one pint of flour, one teaspoonful of salt, two eggs beaten lightly, and milk enough to make this a thick batter; beat all together well and bake on a griddle.

Candied Lemon or Poppyseed for Cakes.—Boil one and one half pounds of sugar in a half pint of water, till it begins to evenly round the sides; put in eight drops of essence; pour it upon buttered paper, and cut it with a knife.

Toothache.—Take equal parts of camphor, sulphuric ether, ammonia, lutanum, tincture of cayenne, and one-sixth part of cloves. Mix well together, saturate with the liquid a small piece of cotton and apply to the cavity of the diseased tooth, and the pain will cease immediately.

Alum in Starch.—For starching muslins, gingham, and calicoes, dissolve of alum the size of a shell-bark, for every pint of starch, and add to it. By so doing the colors will keep bright for a long time, which is very desirable when dresses must be often washed, and the cost is but a trifle.

Corn-Starch Custard Pie.—Very nice pies are made with two eggs, and two large tubs of corn-starch to a quart of milk; sweeten and spice to taste; corn-starch should be mixed smooth with milk and eggs beaten up in it, then thin out with more milk; sweeten, season, pour into pan lined with paste, and grate a little nutmeg over the top.

To Increase the Laying of Eggs.—The best method is to mix with their food, every other day, about a teaspoonful of ground cayenne pepper to each dozen tows. While up on this subject, it would be well to say, that if your hens lay soft eggs, or eggs without shells, you should put plenty of old plaster, egg shells or even yester-shells broken up, where they can get at it.

To Prevent Snow-Water From Penetrating Shoes.—This simple and effectual remedy is nothing more than a little beeswax and nutmeg, warm in a poplin until a liquid state. Then rub some of it lightly over the edges of the sole where the stitches are, which will prevent the backing from having the usual effect.

Hair Wash.—Take one ounce of oxal, half an ounce of camphor, powder these ingredients very fine, and dissolve them in one quart boiling water; when cool the solution will be ready for use; damp the hair frequently. This wash effectually loosens, beautifies, and strengthens the hair, preserves the color, and prevents early baldness. The impurities will form into lumps after being dissolved, but the water will be sufficiently impregnated.

Use of Brine.—Many farmers row away the old brine in beef and pork barrels and fish packages, sometimes they pour it on a grassy patch or under a tree and kill the vegetation. If they desire to kill vegetation with it they should pour on patches of burdocks or thistles, around trees that are worthless, it is better, however, to use it for manure, in which case it should be used with judgment. It may be applied to asparagus beds or quinces liberally, but to other things sparingly. Otherwise the best distinction to make of it is to pour it mature or compost heap and it will be absorbed.
